### Overton Annual Parish Meeting

This will take place in St Luke's Hall at 7.45pm on Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> May. There will be several speakers - Cllr Rob Golding about ongoing planning issues including the Local Development Framework, Carole Ruse and Simon Christian of Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council about Community Planning and Summer Streetz, followed by the St Luke's Hall Trustees presenting the latest news on their refurbishment plans and PC Richard Baldwin who will give a roundup of police news for the year (always a visual treat). The evening will finish with drinks and refreshments provided by the WI.

### The Harroway

Due to the poor weather, the refurbishment work has been postponed and the byway remains closed to *all* users.

The Harroway is a highway, so the rules applying to metalled roads are still relevant - vehicles must be taxed/insured/with a valid MOT and the rider/driver must hold a current licence. The police, Hampshire County Council and legal users of The Harroway have agreed to report illegal usage, to ensure that the byway remains safe and that the destruction of the track and the countryside around it does not continue.

### St Mary's Hall Garden

Now that spring is just about here, please remember that this garden - at the back of St Mary's Hall - is available for the quiet enjoyment of all Overton's residents and visitors. To access the garden please go down the passage under the wrought-iron St Mary's Garden sign (to the right of the hall).

This year we are proudly celebrating 30 years of our Society, which started on 9<sup>th</sup> April 1980 when a group of enthusiasts held an inaugural meeting in the Community Centre. ODS was formed as a community group to give public showings of plays, pantomimes and live entertainment, with rehearsals held at Southington House and shows staged then, as now, in St. Mary's Hall. **The Fumed Oak** and **The Monkey's Paw**, two one-act plays, were our first productions.

We hold two shows a year - musicals, pantomimes, variety shows or plays - each entertaining 600 people on average. We get more ambitious each time and have a great team capable of remarkable special effects.

### ODS has some fabulous shows planned for 2010!

Well into rehearsal at present is the hilarious comedy **The Farndale Avenue Murder Mystery (F.A.H.E.T.G.D.S)** which runs from Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> to Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> May in St Mary's Hall - and tickets are available now from The Overton Gallery at 20 High Street.

Our second show, in late November, is the pantomime **Once Upon A Time** which continues the stories of the main traditional pantos and allows us to celebrate 30 years of ODS pantos.

Overton is a thriving village and ODS is part of it, supporting other groups and village events, fund-raising for local charities and actively helping the retention and the refurbishment of St Mary's Hall, which is an ideal venue for live performance events.

There are many social activities within ODS as well, including theatre/shopping trips, beer bus, barbecues and parties such as on New Year's Eve and after each show. We also hire out technical equipment & costumes.

People of all ages are welcome and new members are joining ODS all the time, not only for acting and singing but painting scenery, making costumes, doing makeup, helping set up lights, backstage work, front of house, producing, directing - and much more.

We are looking forward to a continued great future and encourage you to join in with new ideas and new shows.

In particular we need a Treasurer and people with desk-top publication skills (for programme creation and sales).

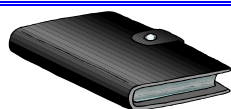
We are open to new ideas and will welcome new members.

### Concessionary fares

At present, Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council is responsible for issuing national bus passes to eligible people. Unlike many local authorities, travel tokens are also offered as an alternative which can be used on other forms of transport. From April 2011 the bus pass scheme will be administered by the county council and discussions are continuing between the two authorities as to whether travel tokens can still be issued and how best to deal county-wide with the variations of bus pass usage, eg start time of journey. ### Hampshire Constabulary offers Safer Vehicles advice

Vehicle crime accounts for more than a quarter of the recorded crime in the UK and costs the taxpayer more than £3 billion a year.

Here in the Overton area, vehicle crime has dropped by 31% on the previous year's figures - but, from Easter onwards, we tend to see a rise in vehicle crime - in particular from rural beauty spot car parks.

Recently, a local resident's house was burgled. The key to the victim's car was stolen and the car driven away by the offenders. Unfortunately, this style of burglary is becoming more commonplace these days as the would be car-thief is unable to circumnavigate the sophisticated security devices in a modern day motor car.

#### What can you do to help?

- \* Do not leave your car keys or any spare set of keys on display within your home, especially if you are away.
- \* Don't leave anything in your car - if it's not there, then it can't be stolen.
- \* Choose a stereo that can be removed and make sure you take it with you! You should also mark it with your registration number or postcode, in case it is stolen.
- \* Thieves aren't picky, so don't leave even low-value items. Often thieves will smash and grab first and look later to see if what they've stolen is valuable.
- \* Don't hide it - if you hide items under the seat or in the glove box, chances are someone will have watched you. If you cannot avoid leaving something in your car, put it in your boot before you begin your journey.
- \* Don't leave valuables in your car even for a minute - it only takes a thief a few seconds to smash a window and get what they want, so don't take the chance.
- \* Your car isn't safe on your driveway - nearly half the incidents where items are stolen from cars happen when they are parked overnight, close to the owner's home.
- \* Don't leave your house keys or anything with your address on it in your vehicle - someone could steal your keys and then let themselves into your home.

**Plea from a local Poyntz Road resident:** Poyntz Road residents have no legal option other than to use the central part of Red Lion Lane when driving away from home. Red Lion Lane is narrow and any inconsiderately parked car can cause mayhem if it blocks the road. This needs to be remembered especially on Fridays when the dustcarts need access. On several occasions bin collection has been disrupted, at a cost to the borough/council tax payer, as a result of poor parking.

**Street lighting:** Several "day burners" exist around Overton (eg 2 Waltham Road, 1 Vinns Lane, 4 Sapley Lane) and have been reported to the following number. They are given a low priority for repair so do not expect prompt correction. Phone 0845 603 5633 to report faults, listing lamp column number, street details and emphasising Overton which is classed as "Basingstoke Rural" on the HCC system.

### Hampshire Constabulary offers Caravan Security Advice

**Caravan Owners - Don't let a criminal steal your holiday - Secure your caravan!**

- \* Lock the caravan head coupling into a good quality hitch-lock. Visit [www.soldsecure.com](http://www.soldsecure.com) for a list of products assessed and tested as suitable for caravans
- \* Remove the wheels and use axle stands
- \* Use locking wheel nuts
- \* Fit an alarm
- \* Low level, dusk-til-dawn driveway lighting will reduce chances for criminals to act under cover of darkness
- \* Close all windows, doors and rooflights every time you leave the vehicle
- \* Never leave registration documents in the caravan or valuables on show, or anything with your address on it
- \* If you are not going to be using your caravan for some time, consider putting it into secure storage

#### Buying and selling caravans

When buying a new caravan, ask about built-in security features - all caravans manufactured since 1997 should be electronically tagged.

When buying second-hand, make sure the caravan's number plate matches the one on the tow car and try to verify the seller is who they say they are.

#### Registration of caravans

Caravans manufactured since 1992 should be automatically registered with the Caravan Registration and Identification Scheme (CRiS).

If it is, it is possible to do a check of the caravan's history through the scheme. It is now possible to register older caravans - call 01722 411 430
