### Planning Applications

#### Agreed by Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council:

**BDB/72523** – Erection of a detached three bedroom dwelling following demolition of existing detached garage and creation of new access at 1 The Green.

**Sapley Lane Playing Field:** Overton Parish Council has given permission for a local men's football team, Tron FC, to use Sapley Lane Playing Field for training on Saturday mornings from 11.00am – 1.00pm and on Tuesday evenings (while it is light enough) from 7.00pm – 9.00pm. The team intends to mark out a pitch and hopes to install goal posts shortly. **If you require any further information or you are interested in joining the team, please contact Darren Hutchins on 771632**

**Bonfires:** The Parish Council receives more complaints about these than any other matter especially during the summer months. Please be considerate to your neighbours by either not having a bonfire at this time of year – or, if you must, having the fire late at night.

**Funfair:** Thank you for all your comments about holding a funfair at Sapley Lane Playing Field. On balance, the Parish Council received more objections than favourable comments - especially from residents bordering the playing field - and has consequently agreed the funfair will not return here in future years.

**Overton Halls:** The Parish Council has agreed to make small grants to three halls within the village, to help complete building projects. These are: £3,000 to **ORC** to replace the roof of the Town Meadow Hut, £3,000 to **OCA** towards the demolition of the "toilet block" extension and replacing the "boys' entrance" on the Community Centre and £2,500 to **St Luke's Hall** for various internal works, doors, decorating and an additional third cubicle in the Ladies' toilets.

## Overton Fire Station News

### A special Feature

#### Beacon Status Award

Earlier this year Overton Fire Station was awarded Beacon Station status - a benchmark used by Hampshire Fire and Rescue Service where stations are rewarded for high performance in risk reduction in their area, thereby making the village and surrounding area a safer place to live.

The achievement was made more special to us as we were the first retained station in Hampshire to attain this status.

With the money we received from this, we have made some internal improvements to the station - and we supported our team of firefighters who entered the Three Peaks Challenge, partly as a team building exercise, but also to raise money for charity.

#### Overton Firefighters - Three Peaks Challenge

Overton Firefighters completed this Challenge on 24<sup>th</sup>/25<sup>th</sup> June in a total time of 19 hours and 7 minutes, beating expectations by nearly 5 hours, qualifying our team for gold medals (less than 20 hours) and placing us 15<sup>th</sup> out of 45 teams.

Setting off at 5.00pm on Thursday evening, we scaled Ben Nevis in 3 hours 33 minutes, before driving through the night to Scafell Pike in the Lake District. This took us 2 hours 58 minutes to climb up and down, before travelling to Snowdon, where the challenge finished once we reached the peak in 1 hour and 41 minutes. We were all exhausted by this point, but very pleased with our achievement.

The team from Overton (Dave Allen, Simon Wiltshire, Neil Glendon, Steven "Snowy" Brown, Nick Simpson, Keith Vallis and Matt Horne) would like to thank everyone for their best wishes and support in helping raise over **£3,000**.

Our two chosen charities are the Firefighters Charity and the Piam Brown Ward (the Regional Paediatric Oncology and Haematology Unit which is based at Southampton General Hospital).

As well as your sponsorship we also raised money by selling draw tickets and were pleased that we had two local winners from this grand draw.

The Overton Fire Station is crewed by Retained Duty System Firefighters. We all work part-time for the Fire Service and give fire cover during our spare time.

At the moment we are looking for people who can give us day cover between 8.00am and 5.00pm. Also shift workers or parents (mums or dads) who have some time during the day while the children are at school.

**Big changes at St Mary's Church**

We launch our new service times at our Harvest Festival services on Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> October. Morning services will now be at 9.30am and 11.15am, with coffee in between - so worshippers at both services can mingle.

### Work at the Overton Community Centre

During the summer holiday, work has been going on to transform the room that Playgroup uses into a fresh, light and airy space. This is just the start, as the contractor is now moving on to work the same magic in the Club Room. Suspended ceilings are being removed to restore both rooms to their original proportions, floors are being sanded and polished, while new lights, power points and smoke detectors are being installed. Outside, the old garage will be re-roofed, rendered and painted, the front part will become a bin store - while, behind a dividing wall, the back section will become a store for Playgroup's garden toys.

Work will then move to the other side of the building, to create an office and reception for the Children's Centre. Also in the programme will be complete overhauls for both the Library and the Palmer Room.

This is very exciting for the OCA, but we realise that there is a lot of inconvenience as well. Our apologies to everyone affected. We very much hope that, once it is all finished, you will agree with us that it really has been worth it! It is likely that work will continue until December. Wherever possible we are keeping the Community Centre open for its usual activities, although some evening meetings will be in the Playroom rather than the Clubroom for a short while.

Our thanks go, too, to the Methodist Church where some groups will be meeting during all the upheaval.

**Remembrance Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> November:** It is hoped that the Overton community will unite in commemorating this year's parade. Planning is under way and the parade will be longer than in previous years - taking in more of Winchester Street, turning left at the traffic lights, then right into Bridge Street and on to the Church for the Remembrance Service. I appeal to all organised groups and individuals alike to join in the parade - or at least come out and support it as it passes through the Village. I'll be interested to hear from anyone with any ideas on how we can enhance our existing parade - in particular about decorating the route with bunting and flags.

**Overton Beat Statistics:** July is usually a busy month. Considering the fantastic weather we had, I am pleased to report that we had only five reported crimes for the entire Beat Area. We normally average 19 x crimes for July, but this month's figure is the lowest for the Beat Area since I started back in July 2005: the previous lowest month was 8 x crimes in June 2009. The total for 2010 to date = 86 x reported crimes (compared to 98 in 2009).

**Action we have taken in relation to the local Policing priorities:**

**1) Environmental Issues - including Graffiti, Littering & Dog Fouling:** We are monitoring the situation and I'm pleased to say that the spate of Graffiti that the Village experienced a few months ago seemed to be an isolated incident with no further attacks. Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council were advised of the matter and within days had removed all traces of the paint.

There has been a recent problem with youths leaving litter up at the Berrydown Football Pitches - local Police will be dealing with this and will issue Fixed Penalty Notices to anyone caught leaving litter.

**2) Anti-social behaviour and Criminal Damage around the Village:** We have been tackling issues relating to Anti-Social Behaviour in and around the Edward Kersley Playing Fields ("The Rec"). This includes utilising the Designated Public Places Order (DPPO) where we have seized a large amount of alcohol from local teenagers (15 to 18year olds). The problem seems to have moved to the Berrydown Football pitches and we are now tackling similar issues of rowdy behaviour at that location.

About 40 local residents attended a street meeting in July in the Edward Kersley Playing Field and we heard their concerns regarding anti-social behaviour in and around the park area. We advised them that we will target the area on our patrols and urged them to contact the Police by using the "101" number to report any anti-social behaviour. We had only five incidents of Rowdy & Inconsiderate behaviour reported to us throughout the month and reports of Criminal Damage are down in the area by 36%.

**3) Road Safety across the Beat Area:** I have listened to the concerns of residents of Overton Hill about the speed of the traffic up and down the London Road and have conducted hi-vis patrols in the area. Officers from the Roads Policing Unit recently completed speed enforcement activity on the B3400 and as a result two fixed penalty notices were issued for excess speed and four speed awareness courses have been offered to members of the public. Only three minor RTIs in the Village were reported to the Police (one of which resulted in damage to the shop front of Parnell Jordy & Harvey estate agents)

**4) Offenders brought to justice:** In July three people were arrested for various offences of note. A 15 year old local youth was arrested for the graffiti attack on various buildings around the Village in May.

**Transport and Lighting News**

**Transport Forum 31<sup>st</sup> July:**

Many issues were raised which the operators, B&DBC and HCC, have promised to consider. These include:

**Buses:** Sunday services / getting 76/86 to use more than B3400 in Overton / misleading departure times on some bus shelters / congestion at Basingstoke Railway Station bus lay-by / need for real time bus information at shelters / concern about future of 74 Shuttle service and desire for later buses on Saturdays / notification of delays to those waiting.

**Trains: Overton Railway Station** - extra shelters should be in place on the platforms during September according to SWT's Stakeholder manager / need for more width at the disabled bay / need to destroy Japanese knotweed. **Basingstoke Railway Station** - toilet facilities when those at Bus Station are closed / poor connections into this line from the cross country services / need for a bus kiosk / forthcoming revamp of station frontage as part of the Malls' upgrading
